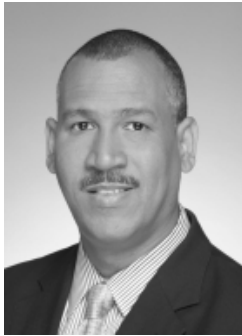

General Fee: All students pay a \$125 general fee. (Note: this fee includes library fee, classroom supplies fee, home Cougar games etc.)

Housing Fee: On campus single students pay a housing fee of \$2,400 per semester. On campus students are required to take 12 or more hours of classes each semester.
